

Transportation

Welcome to Beijing! We are excited to have you join us. Here are some transportation tips to help you reach the conference venue.

Conference Venue Address: No.1 Zhongguancun South Street, Haidian District, Beijing, China

1. From Beijing Capital International Airport (BCIA)

We recommend two different ways to get from Beijing Capital International Airport to the Friendship Hotel, ranked by our recommendation:

A. Line 4 bus (首都国际机场-公主坟 (4线公主坟线)): From BCIA Terminal 2 to the Friendship Hotel, the total travel time is 56 minutes (without traffic) and costs 30 RMB (4.21 USD).

B. Taxi: It takes approximately 30 minutes (without traffic) and costs 130 RMB (18.26 USD).

2. From Beijing Daxing International Airport

We recommend that you take a taxi directly to the Friendship Hotel. The trip takes approximately 47 minutes (without traffic) and costs 230 RMB (32.31 USD).

FYI: Introduction to Beijing's transportation

Air

There are two passenger airports in Beijing: Capital International Airport in the northeast of the city, about 25 kilometers (about 16 miles) from Tiananmen Square and Daxing Airport, about 53 kilometers (33 miles) south of Beijing city center. They both serve domestic and international flights; so double confirm which airport you are going to use, especially when departing from the city. Both the airports can be easily reached by airport shuttle bus, express subway train and taxi. There are also long-distance buses connecting the airports with nearby cities like Langfang and Baoding.

Train

Beijing is the center of China's railway net, which has trains to most of cities of the country. The main railway lines here include Jingjiu Railway from Beijing to Kowloon in Hong Kong, Jinghu Railway to Shanghai, Jingguang Railway to Guangzhou and Jingha Railway to Harbin, etc. In recent years, the inter-city railway to Tianjin, the high speed rails to Shanghai and Guangzhou have also been built, by which passengers can get to Tianjin from the capital city in about half an hour, to Shanghai in about 4.5 hours and to Guangzhou in 8 hours. Passengers to / from the city are now served by about 800 trains at four railway stations:

Subway

Beijing subway is the fastest transportation in downtown and it is a good way to avoid frequent traffic jams. Beijing was the first city in China to operate a subway, with its first line opened in 1971. Beijing had 23 subway lines in operation, including two airport express lines and two tram lines. At present, Beijing's rail transit has a total mileage of 807 kilometers (501 miles), with 475 stations, including 81 transfer stations, connecting the downtown areas like the Tian'anmen Square, Qianmen, and Wangfujing with many suburban areas.
